The theme "From Darkness to (In) Sight" is taken from the texts we will be hearing from the lectionary throughout the Season of Lent. As Jesus encounters people throughout the gospel in a variety of settings, he helps each one find their way from their spiritual darkness to deeper insight.

The Lent series this year will include several worship services and one intergenerational event all designed to help grow in insight as we reflect on God's Word together.

Exploring Mandalas as a Means of Reflection
The evening program will be led by Rachelle
Oppenhuizen who will share a brief introduction to
mandalas that will be easily accessible to children and
adults. Mandalas provide a simple and elementary
"container" within which self-exploration and discovery
of inner dynamics can be easily engaged. The mandala
serves as both a tool of discovery and the expression of
relatively unrecognized aspects of Soul. Our explorations
with various materials and forms will be designed to
support the spiritual practices of self-examination which
are a part of the Lenten Disciplines. The children will
have time with Jocelyn VanHeest, Children's Ministry
Director, to create a mandala of their own.

The Worship, Prayer and Spirituality Ministry, in conjunction with the Health Ministry, offers Healing Prayer Services several times a year. People are invited to share in this liturgy of healing prayer and are offered the opportunity to come forward to share in prayer with one of the elders or pastors if desired. People are also invited to write down prayer concerns in the weeks leading up to the Service and those concerns will be included in the litany for healing.

The Cross Shop: Finding Healing at the Intersection

During Lent you will find a "Cross Shop" sitting on a table in the sanctuary. The cross has become a symbol within our faith for the intersection between our need and God's promise of healing and salvation. The Health Ministry offers this space during Lent for people to take a cross and write a word or name that represents a place in your life or someone you know who needs healing, hope, forgiveness, guidance, or grace. As you leave that cross in the cross shop for the season, the community will be lifting those needs up in prayer knowing that when our needs intersect with God's promises we receive healing even if we cannot know or name what that healing will look like.

Devotional Materials

For Adults: Signs of Lent

A series of weekly handouts will be available which invite you to connect with Jesus' ministry through tangible signs such as water, wind and light encountering the holy in unexpected places. Each weekly handout includes artwork to help engage the heart and open the mind as a means of reflecting on the texts that will be utilized in worship both on Sunday mornings and during the Wednesday Lent Series.

For Youth: Lent 2014 Teen Calendar

A colorful Lenten calendar provides brief, spiritual reflections for each day in Lent. Each day, with eyes focused on Christ's cross, encourages you to answer your call as God's servant.

For Families with Older Children: Do Whatever He Tells You!

This Lenten family devotional booklet uses the words of Jesus as centerpieces for daily prayer. With devotions from Ash Wednesday through Easter, this booklet will help foster daily family prayer and faith-sharing around what Jesus told us to do: "love one another", "forgive and you will be forgiven", "do not be afraid", and many more.

For Families with Young Children: These Stones Will Shout!

This daily Lenten devotional will lead children and their families down a Lenten pathway to Easter as they learn about Christ, our Cornerstone. The journey culminates with the rolling stone on Easter morning. Each devotion focuses on a rocky theme from Scripture.
