Hope Church will support La Pouponniére, an orphanage located in Dakar, Senegal, that Germaine Pellebon-Smith supports. The Center, in the heart of Senegal's capitol city, has served the needs of some of the most vulnerable infants and children in the country—as well as children seeking refuge from war and other conflicts in neighboring countries—since 1955. Hope Church will also support Children in Vietnam with HIV/ AIDS, through the Warm Hold Association, of which Dan Fisher is a part. Currently, they work with 98 children in Ho Chi Minh City and more impoverished areas of Tay Ninh province near the Cambodia border and Tra Vinh province in the Mekong Delta region.

White Gift Offering

These gifts will be brought forward during the offering, and later given to the Center for Women in Transition, a local agency assisting women and families caught in abusive relationships and empowering a hopeful future for them.
