If they were informed of your presence there: Yes! If they did not know about your hospitalization: sadly, no.

Have you ever wondered how the pastors and congregational care ministry members learn about people's needs for care? The very simple answer is they know what people tell them.

So here is a request from your pastors and congregational care group leaders: please let the office know if you are facing a hospitalization or any other time in life when you might appreciate some

outreach and care.


We welcome those calls. If you know of someone going through something and have their permission to pass it along to the pastors, please call and let them know. They much prefer to be told the same thing 15 times than to miss an opportunity to reach out in love to someone in a time of need.

One final note: if you are ever

hospitalized tell the hospital staff to call your pastors if you would like them to know. This should be asked of you during intake. It doesn't always happen so don't hesitate to bring it up yourself. If you ask them to call the church, they will do it. If you want only the pastors to know and not the church office, ask for a chaplain and pass along this request to them. They will then handle the request discreetly and contact the pastors directly.

# Living Hope Capital Campaign

As this newsletter goes to press, we approach several important milestones for the Living Hope Capital Campaign. It's clear that we achieved the \$100,000 challenge grant that was offered for pledges before May 18, by a wide margin. The Capital Campaign Team is humbled by and grateful for the support shown for the continuing mission of Hope Church. May 31 is the date at which progress against our fundraising goal will be assessed, so that a recommendation can be made to Consistory.

Consistory will meet on June 15 to act on the recommendation made by the Living Hope teams, with support from the Stewardship and Finance Ministry. Once the scope of the renovation is set in that meeting, planning for construction can begin in earnest. Watch for communications about decisions and next steps in late June!





# **Caring for Creation**

Many of you are already familiar with the wonderful work of Eighth Day Farm, a local urban farm whose mission is to Love the earth, love our neighbors and love our food! The core of the farm is a seasonal vegetable CSA program that provides weekly shares and half-shares for individuals and families from early June through early November. The farm also donates at least 10% of everything we grow to area food providers including the Community Action House, the Community Kitchen at Western Seminary and the Center for Women in Transition.

They just wrapped up a Kickstarter campaign that will provide the

resources to plant an urban orchard at their southside neighborhood location - the Growth Center - near Zion Lutheran Church (29th and Pine). They're raising money to repaint the outside of the building and plant fruit trees, shrubs and other perennials in a small area of the property that was not being used for food production.

The Caring for Creation ministry has supported this campaign and will have "Hope Church" engraved on a plaque made of recycled wood that will hang in the Growth Center. You're invited to come visit and check it out!

# **Youth Ministry**

When I was 18 years old, I joined a crew of kids from my church to do hurricane relief in Homestead, FL during our Spring Break. Hurricane Andrew had nailed south Florida the August before, becoming one of the costliest hurricanes in American history. I was certain that though my construction skills were limited to hammering thumbs, I mean nails into planks of wood, my work would make a sizeable impact in all of the devastation. Well, there was a sizeable impact made that week, but it had little to do with meeting the vast needs of Homestead. I learned two life lessons. God taught me that there is an entire world out there hungry for the life-giving message and redemptive kingdom work of the gospel and that we cannot do it all on our own. This work starts with God's spirit and it happens through God's church. I have carried these lessons in my heart for over 20 years.

It is with this anticipation of God's formation in the lives of our youth that our ministry teams passionately prepare for our two summer trips. This year Fish Club resumes their annual trek to the Appalachian Trail the first week of June and High Hope's embarks on a workweek at Greenpoint Reformed Church in Brooklyn, NY in August. This will be the 26th year for the A.T. hike, and this will be the 5th time High Hopes has travelled to Greenpoint, so these are good and strong traditions that are being carried forward. It is such a gift to be able to witness all the ways God is at work in connecting their young hearts to God, each other, the church, and the greater world.

There are two specific ways that you too can connect with this work. Please be in prayer for our teams; that God would give us safety and robust health before, during, and after our

trips. We are also in need of funds for the High Hopes trip. In fact, save June 28 on your calendars! After a three year hiatus, High Hopes will be resuming our 1950's drive in, where you can feast on hotdogs and ice cream. Check upcoming bulletins for more details.

As always, let me say thank you to you all for the honor and blessing of working with the youth of Hope Church. They are gift to me, just as they are a gift to our church.

# The Health and Healing Ministry -- Is More Than Checking Blood Pressures!!

We attempt to create a congregational atmosphere which understands and values the deep connection between our faith and our health. Even though we are a subcommittee in Congregational Care, we are ready to help all of Hope Church ministries accomplish their missions. To accomplish this, we offer many opportunities for you to participate in living this connection between your faith and your health.

- Healing Prayer Services during the year (cooperative effort of Worship, Prayer, Spirituality and the Music Ministries).
- Yearly Adult Education Series. Last fall we presented 4 sessions on Integrative/Holistic Health topics.
- Weekly Flex and Balance exercises for older adults led by Maxine DeBruyn on Thursday afternoons at 1:30 pm.
- Monthly newsletter articles with our Health Ministry Bulletin

Board featuring the same theme, with books, pamphlets and other information on a topic for you to read. The CARE NOTE rack is nearby.

- Maintain medical equipment to borrow for use at home. Maintain first aid kits and the defibrillator.
- Provide a flu shot clinic in the fall
- Frequently hold Blood Drives in cooperation with our neighbor
   The First United Methodist Church.
- Summertime exercise challenges like GO AND GLOW.
- Monthly Blood Pressure checks and consultations on Pizza Sunday.
- The Knitting Ministry promotes and keeps track of those who receive Prayer Shawls.

This past fall we provided a picture directory of Hope Church Medical Persons. This will help the Deacons be familiar with them in case of an emergency.

Last October, MAKING CHOICES MICHIGAN was featured as an Advanced Care Planning and Advance Directive evening to promote conversations between persons who are designated as a medical Power of Attorney and those for whom they may have to speak.

In March we said "good bye" to our Parish Nurse, Donita Robards, who moved to Georgia to be with her 3 sons. This May we welcomed our new Parish Nurse, Ginger Clark, who is eager to begin her ministry with us at Hope Church. She is eager to meet you.

Health Ministry is a support for our Parish Nurse and Congregational Care visitors. Please let us know of your needs and suggestions for future events.

Hopefully, the Caregivers Support Group will re-organize soon and other support groups will be inspired to begin – especially one for those living with depression and/or other mental health situations.

New members are always welcome. Come and join us and learn the importance of why Churches should care about HEALTH as well as FAITH.

# A Window into Classis Exams and Beyond

Classis exams for ministerial candidates in the RCA can produce some anxiety. I am preparing for mine now. But rather than feeling dominated by anxiety, I'm rather stimulated by many thoughtful and beautiful questions that the examiners pose to us ahead of time to get us thinking. Take this one, for example:

"Share with us about a doctrine or theological accent in the Reformed tradition that makes your heart sing."

I love that the Reformed tradition celebrates God's Spirit and Word in all places and facets of life. This is expressed quite beautifully in a stanza from the RCA's 1978 statement of faith, Our Song of Hope:

God's Spirit speaks in the world According to God's ultimate word in Christ In every time and place In technology and business In art and education God has not been left without a

The Word has entered Where we have failed to go

witness

We do not bring Christ to the world. Christ, as Spirit and Word has been here since the beginning, and goes before us in every place and person and gifting. God is pleased that we are witnesses—attentive to where our spirit testifies with Christ's and ready to confirm God's work wherever we find it.

The mystery of God's powerful Word already present, the Spirit at work, brings me to praise, and wonder, and humility. And I find it an instructive theological accent as we begin to examine our strategic questions as a church in the coming months. Which prompt their own questions in me:

"In what surprising or unlikely places could we 'do church' – or meet Christ?"
